

Waterloo, March 22, 2020 — To contribute to the collective effort to reduce the spread of the Coronavirus (COVID-19), the Town of Waterloo has closed the playgrounds in its public parks as of midnight on Sunday March 22nd, and they will remain closed until further notice. Any structures in parks such as bandstands and kiosks will also be inaccessible. Also closed to the public: the dog park, skatepark and pumptrack.

Mr. Jean-Marie Lachapelle has appealed to the population: "It is our collective duty to act and take the necessary preventive measures. I ask for the collaboration of all citizens of Waterloo. We cannot allow our children and teenagers out to play in the playgrounds, the skate park and the pumptrack. We can't have gatherings in public areas. Adults have an important part to play in this situation. They need to be good role models; they must follow the recommendations from the government and the Town. We must work together to contain the Coronavirus."
