

Waterloo, March 20th 2020 — Considering current events and the context which places the Town of Waterloo in a position of uncertainty, the administration has decided to cancel all public events authorized by the Town, from now through July 1st.

Activities and events that have been canceled

- Easter egg hunt (April 11)
- Easter movie at the Maison de la culture de Waterloo (April 19)
- Family day— Pump track challenge (May 30)
- Golf tournament fundraiser for the new baseball diamond (June 12)
- Quebec’s national holiday (June 23-24)

The context of uncertainty that will prevail for the next few months is short-circuiting the planning and organization for these activities and events. The business community, our associations and volunteers are the resources who contribute, each in their own way, to the success of the events we organize. These collaborations have obviously been greatly affected by the Coronavirus pandemic, and the Town’s goal is to reduce the pressure on the community that this exceptional situation has generated. The town resources that had been set aside for these events will be directed into the exceptional measures taken in the current situation.

Depending on the evolution of the situation, the Town is currently considering a community event at the end of the summer or early fall to replace the Family day- Pump track challenge and Quebec’s national holiday. Decisions will be made at a later date, following the recommendations from the government as they evolve over time.

Regarding the golf tournament, there are currently several possible rescheduling options. The administration will decide in the coming months if the fundraiser for the construction of the new baseball diamond should take place later this summer, in the fall or moved forward to 2021.

Concerning the two planned Easter activities, they are cancelled and will not be rescheduled.
